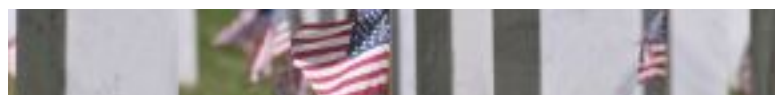

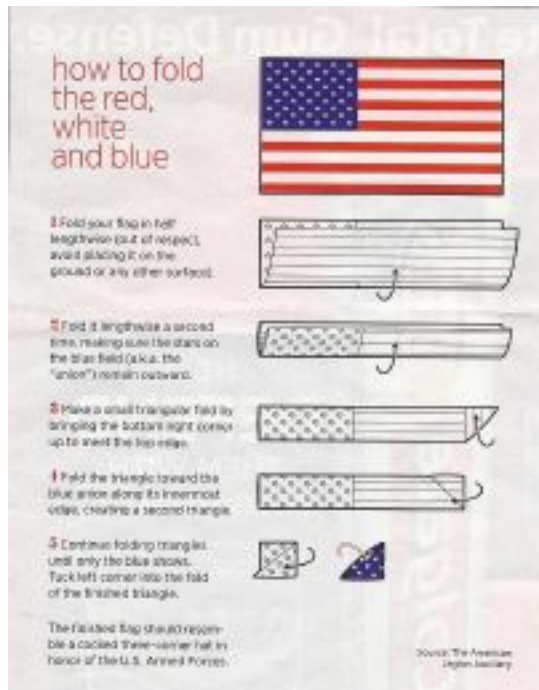

Carroll O'Connor (Aug. 2, 1924- June 21, 2001) appeared in dozens of movies and TV shows, but he's best remembered as the crusty but lovable Archie Bunker in the groundbreaking '70s sitcom "All in the Family." Here are some facts about O'Connor:

During World War II, O'Connor served in the U.S. Merchant Marine.

In 1946, O'Connor enrolled at the University of Montana to study English and theater. He met his future wife, Nancy, during a production there. O'Connor's talent was discovered on the college stage, and he signed with Gate Theatre in Dublin.

O'Connor's character Archie Bunker lived in Queens, N.Y., the same borough where O'Connor grew up. The armchair that Archie so fiercely guarded is displayed in the Smithsonian Institution.
